MINIMUM ADMISSION STANDARDS FOR THE NURSING MOBILITY PROGRAM

1. Unconditional admission to NACC.
2. Good standing with the College including a minimum overall, cumulative GPA of 2.0 at their current, or transferring institution.
3. Official transcripts **from all schools** previously attended must be received in the registrar's office by the mobility nursing application deadline.
4. Minimum 2.5 GPA is required on the program general education prerequisite courses. The prerequisite courses are English 101, MTH 100 or higher-level math, BIO 201, BIO 202, SPH 106/107, and PSY 210 (These courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher).
5. An ACT composite score is required with no minimum score for acceptance into the mobility program. The ACT score will be used for ranking. There is no expiration date on the ACT for this mobility nursing program application. An official ACT score can be accessed from www.ACT.org (NOT a screenshot from the ACT website).
6. Completed mobility nursing application submitted to the NACC Nursing Department by 4 PM on the appropriate deadline.
7. Meet the *Essential Functions/Eligibility Requirements* for nursing (See website).
8. An active unencumbered or unrestricted LPN license in the state of Alabama.
9. If currently working as an LPN, include an employment verification letter on the agency letterhead.
